# 2. Key Centre Policies

### Centre Priorities/Statement of Purpose

At Agnes Goode we believe in excellence in education and care, and that every child should achieve their potential. Agnes Goode Kindergarten and Occasional Care is an environment designed to support all learners. Our



children, families and educators are all life-long learners. Educators at Agnes Goode Kindergarten strive to work together with children and families to ensure that the kindergarten is a supportive and engaging community where learning is inclusive, stimulating and meaningful. The environment will offer an atmosphere of respect and positivity where every learner's strengths are acknowledged and areas for growth supported. The kindergarten provides time for learners to be kind, curious, committed, courageous and proactive. Our educators guide learners through their learning journey in a responsive and thoughtful manner. Our educators value child/family input and encourage them to take turns guiding the curriculum as we acknowledge the home is the children's first learning environment. Educators place great value on families input as they are the child's first and primary educators.

We believe that children:

- learn best in a play based learning environment, actively constructing understanding of their world with emphasis on the natural environment and open-ended play
- learn best when they are engaged, intrinsically motivated, secure, empowered, confident, and have a `voice' which is valued and respected
- should have opportunities to access a broad range of experiences to support a sense of connection, belonging within an active, inclusive learning community

We believe that families:

- are children's first and primary educators who should feel welcomed, valued, respected, informed, and supported
- will be provided opportunities to be supported in their role as parents
- are encouraged to be actively and authentically involved in the kindergarten program

We believe that educators:

- extend and enrich children's experiences, lifelong love of learning and a sense of wonder
- provide an authentic, safe, inviting, stimulating, nurturing, inspiring learning environment
- focus on building strong relationships and support children in developing positive dispositions for learning
- provide a program that is well planned, documented, evaluated, responsive, relevant and meaningful

Indoors we have large open rooms that can be closed to allow for smaller individual settings also when required. We have sound proofing on our ceilings and large windows which allow for lots of
