Enrolments vary between 25 and 40 children depending on site funding and site capacity. This site generally has 3 year old children attending as per DfE



enrolment policy. The site is situated near emergency housing and caters for families who may currently be transient and who may attend for short periods of time or intermittently.

Staff work closely with the DfE support services team, meeting regularly to plan for children's needs and support families

- Staff meet as a team each fortnight to plan for individual children's interests and needs using observations and reports. An overall site program is developed and includes specific planning around literacy, numeracy, STEAM, child protection, cultural events, sustainability, and social and emotional regulation.

Access to special support staff

DfE Support Services Team Members, including a Speech Pathologist, Psychologis and Special Educator are available after consultation and upon request. Families access these services after discussions with Centre staff. Support workers are allocated each term according to the number and level of needs of the children that attend and district budgetary restraints.

We work closely with several other services that support our children on a regular basis including Autism SA, I Can Jump Puddles, Aboriginal Support workers, CAYS, GP Plus Marion and flinders Uni OT students.

Other

Bilingual support workers are an important part of our staff team as we have families from diverse cultural backgrounds. Staff are allocated each term according to numbers of children, level of needs, availability of workers speaking a particular language and budgetary restraints.

5. Centre Facilities

Buildings and grounds

The kindy is a 45 -year old building located on a corner of Marion Road and Nunyah Avenue. The building has an office recently renovated and updated, multiple store rooms, central kitchen, L-shaped play area with another separate room which offers additional internal play space, 2 children's toilets, and an adult toilet including disability facilities. A separate staff room is situated at the back of the siteThe outdoor play space is situated at the back of the building and was completely re landscaped and updated 5 years ago. A new garden space was developed in 2024 for children to engage in planting and harvesting activities and as an addition to our sustainability engagement.
