- ♦ QA1 & 5: Educational Program and Practice & Relationships with children– educator work in Senses, Sensory Processing, Literacy and numeracy and the progress recorded against the dispositions of Curiosity, Resourcefulness and Persistence and the strengthening of programming through an emergent curriculum process
- ♦ QA 2, 3, 6: & 7 Children's Health & Safety; Physical Environment; Collaborative Partnerships & Governance & Leadership- Redevelopment and Extension
- ♦ QA 4: Staffing Arrangements– Primary Caregiving Group Reflections and Performance Development including Growth Coaching

Families were invited to review our work in the National Quality Standards with 2 to 9 parents identifying strengths across all 7 Areas and 1 parent identifying supervision as an area for improvement.
