What to bring

Your child needs to bring these items each day:

- A bag/backpack for their belongings
- One lunchbox containing a morning snack, lunch and an afternoon snack
- A drink bottle containing water
- A broad-brimmed, legionnaire or sun-safe hat (without a chin strap) or your child may use a hat kept at kindy
- At least one change of clothes

Please write your child's name on all their belongings including spare clothes.

What not to bring

Children should not bring these things:

- ♦ food containing nuts (some children have nut allergies that can be dangerous)
- ♦ unhealthy food or drink (lollies, chocolate, chips, fizzy drinks)
- ♦ toys from home.

Enrolment and fees

When your child can start preschool

Your child is entitled to access 1 year of preschool.

If your child turns 4 before 1 May, they can start preschool at the beginning of the year. If your child turns 4 on or after 1 May, they can start the next year.

If you want to delay your child's start to preschool or you're not sure about when they should start, please talk to us about your options.

If your child is Aboriginal or under guardianship (in care) they are eligible for 12 hours of preschool after they turn 3. They will then be eligible for 15 hours per week of preschool in the year before they start school.

Early entry

Your child may be able to come to preschool 1 term earlier, in term 4 the year before starting their preschool year, if they:

- ♦ have additional needs or disability
- ♦ are learning English as an additional language or dialect
- ♦ are at significant risk because of family circumstances.

Early entry is for up to 6 hours per week, if places are available.

Access is decided on a case-by-case basis.

Please contact us if you want more information about early entry.

Enrolling your child

You can register your interest to enrol your child with us by using the preschool registration of interest form www.education.sa.gov.au/parents-and-families/enrol-school-or-preschool/preschool-and-kindergarten-enrolment/register-enrol-preschool This form is also available from us.

Try to register your interest by 30 June, but you can do this any time during the year.

Priority will be given to children living in our catchment area.

(<https://www.preschools.sa.gov.au/bertram-hawker-kindergarten#location>) If you don't live in our catchment area you should indicate at least 2 other preschool options on your form.

If we can give your child a place with us we'll send you an offer letter in term 3

Before your child starts

We will contact you in October about an orientation session. This will be a 1-hour session where you can ask questions.

Before they start preschool your child can come to pre-entry transition visits. These will be in term 4 and are a chance for your child to meet our staff and other children.

Policies

Our policies are available on our website and a hardcopy can be viewed at our site and provided on request.

Fees

We ask you to contribute towards the cost of your child attending preschool.

The parent contribution is \$1,080 per year. You can choose to pay the total amount at the beginning of the year or pay instalments of \$270 each term.

Concessions

Concessions are available for families with a health care card or Centrelink concession card.

When to pay

We will invoice you via your parent pigeon hole in week 1 of each term.

Payments are due in week 3 of each term.

Please contact us if you are having difficulty paying.

How to pay

Cash or cheque

You can pay cash or cheque at the kindy. Please put the payment in a sealed envelope with your child's full name on the front. Give the envelope to the director or a teacher.
