Core Values:

Our philosophy at Christie Downs Kindergarten Porlis' Pulgi is that every child is special with a connection to land and community. Spiritual growth and valuing the individuality of each child's diversity of cultural background is nurtured. Our play-based learning program supports the children's desire to come to kindy and enthusiasm to learn and gain successful outcomes.

Relationships with children and their parents are paramount along with a safe and welcoming environment crucial in supporting wellbeing along with the happiness and joy gained from the wonder experienced in early childhood and our learning program. Staff strongly advocate for the inclusion of our Aboriginal children and parents into the wider community in a variety of creative and positive ways. Staff are connected, resourceful and committed to the environment within the kindy and wider community, which also supports our holistic and flexible service delivery program to engage with the community and bond with children.

Our staff believe that "How you treat Aboriginal children works for all children but how you treat non-Aboriginal children does not necessarily work for Aboriginal children" as stated by Professor John Hattie, 2016.

Performance Management Program: Director participates in Performance Reviews with Education Director each term. The Director undertakes Performance reviews with all staff at the site in terms 1 and 4 and as needed.

5. Centre Facilities

Buildings and grounds:

A single brick veneer building. There is one main activity area. Three storage sheds, two separate and free standing and one incorporated into the building. The property is fenced on three sides with galvanised iron, and pool fencing at the front of the building.

The large outdoor area has a cubby house, sandpit, swings, platform structure with an attached slippery dip, African thatch and ramp, Wilto Wadhli (wedge tailed eagle) free standing building, mud kitchen, dry creek bed with a swing bridge, vegetable garden and climbing equipment. An additional feature is the digging patch with moss rocks surrounds and tree logs and a Wadhli (Aboriginal building structure) for the children to enjoy.

The environment has a focus on Kaurna land and how the earth connects the children to the seasonal changes in nature. Our environment is a place where the children can use symbolic play to develop their sense of fun and discovery.

Schools to which children generally transfer from this preschool:

Our centre is in close proximity to Christies Downs Primary School.

The majority of our children will attend one of the many feeder schools in the district. These include Christies Beach, Coorara, Hackham West, Hackham East, Antonio Prmary, Lonsdale Heights, Pimpala, Seaford Y-7, St John the Apostle Calvary Lutheran, Reynella East and Seaford Primary.

Christies Beach Primary School is the closest OSHC and Vacation Care Centre for the community.

Establishment of new service(s)/program(s):

Sustainability program: There are a number of vegetable and flower beds to support sustainability. We will establish the new chicken coop and source the eggs and chickens. There are a number of rainwater tanks around the yard to support our water supply.

Partnership arrangements with other groups

Our centre networks with other Aboriginal and Non-Aboriginal organisations, along with Government and non- Government agencies. These links are important for us to access resources including funding, personnel, materials, and is a source for information sharing.

The various Lion's Clubs are very supportive of our centre and have donated funds to purchase a fridge and freezer and supply us with clothes and bedding for the community. Assistance from various organisations support our Family Christmas Party.

Food bank is another organisation who is affiliated with our centre and we receive bread and food donations on a weekly basis to share with families.
