# **Our Philosophy**

#### We believe that children are at the centre of what we do

- Each child is valued and unique with individual needs
- Every child has rights; including the right to be safe, to be treated equitably, to have their opinions and ideas heard and to have a say in matters that affect them
- Trusting and caring relationships between children and educators are essential for learning
- Independence and personal responsibility are encouraged and developed
- We encourage children to be active, sustainable citizens, who care for our community and world now and in the future.
- Children are members of communities, and we allow time and opportunities for children to practice interactions with others to promote caring relationships, learning and a positive self-concept
- Circle of Security practice is central to our interactions with all children and families.

# We believe that children are capable and competent

- Families are their first teachers and children begin Kindy with unique knowledge, strengths, and interests
- · Children are encouraged to make choices and take control of their own learning
- Children learn through play and our curriculum aims to provide interesting, challenging experiences, varied resources, and open-ended materials to encourage the development of new understandings, skills, and concepts
- The educator's role is to respond to children's play ideas, their interests, explorations, and wonderings to build on their current knowledge and support and extend children's skills, knowledge, and development. The inquiry approach to learning allows educators and children to be partners in the learning process.

# We believe that positive relationships with families are vital

- All families want the best for their children
- Families know their children intimately
- Families are unique and are respected and made to feel welcome at Kindy
- Families are partners in their children's learning, and we work with them in sharing information, ideas and support collaborative goals to improve learning
