#### From our Under 3 Team

In the under 3's its all about getting messy and enjoying the feeling of different textures. We weave this through messy play activities like finger paint, cloud dough, shaving cream, and also by adding soap, sand, bark etc to the regular water play and sandpit. We offer a range of food to explore. Developing an ability to touch many textures helps our children's nervous system mature and supports their self-regulation in later years. Its also source much fun. The Unders are learning about farm animals as a way to build important word-banks, engage with new books and to be able to play in both the Over 3 space and the Under 3 space confidently. It has been wonderful to see how much learning transfers from one to the other. The little kids learn from the big kids, but then the big ones learn from the little ones. Our Indigenous lullaby song for the BBQ is a favourite to sing at a quieter time and the children are learning other nursery rhymes to perform at the BBQ. #### From our Over 3 team

In the Over 3's we have been focusing on building the children's understanding around

healthy foods and thoughtful choices through a book-based focus on the Very Hungry Caterpillar and Tasting Thursdays. Our children look at the range of foods in this favorite story and explore the ways in which they can be eaten (raw, cooked, sliced, whole). They give them a personal rating. This encourages risk taking with new sensory experiences, widening food preferences, understanding of "healthy"



and "sometimes" foods. It also encourages a range of maths processes (ways of learning) including: independent thinking and reasoning about our views, creating & reading data (charts and lists), evaluating and comparing, sorting and grouping. These are critical maths skills that develop BEST in a playful and PEAL context. They are learnt faster because the child is already motived to learn. Our goal is always to enhance children's learning in all areas through engagement and motivation, which comes from real-life uses, and learning in a positive relationship with others.
