- ➤ There is a slow but steadily increasing number of other cultures who do not have English as their first language.
- Schools to which children generally transfer from this preschool
- Kadina Memorial School, Wallaroo Mines Primary School, St. Mary McKillop School and Harvest Christian College.
- We also occasionally have children transition to Wallaroo Primary School, Bute Primary School and Moonta Area School.
- Other local care and educational facilities, eg child care, schools, OSHC
- There are Family Day Care provider within the town, Kadina Child Care Centre, Community Kids Childcare Centre, Out of School Hours Care service at Wallaroo Primary School that does bus pickups, TAFE, Community Library, Uni Hub
- Commercial/industrial and shopping facilities
- ➤ A wide range of small business and some larger stores.
- Kadina also has several government offices and services.

- Medical clinic, Copper Coast Sport and Leisure Centre and swimming pool, several sporting clubs.
- Netball and Football is played during the winter season with a strong sense of community.
