:Klemzig Kindergarten provides an accessible, quality teaching and learning program for preschool and occasional care children in a safe, caring and supportive environment.

> : Through the use of a play based program where the children learn through exploring, creating and experimenting, individual needs and abilities are programmed for and developed.

:Klemzig Kindergarten's priorities and objectives are:

:Early intervention program which occurs at the beginning of each session. The children are divided into smaller groups and specific literacy and numeracy activities are implemented.

:Early intervention and early- entry processes are in place. We work cooperatively with Specialist Services within the Northern Region in providing programs for all children with a specific emphasis on working with children with additional needs.

6. Local Community

: The Community is changing in a dynamic way. Many new families have recently moved into the area and this has been evident with children attending that have just recently arrived to Australia and other families that have moved from interstate. Children are attending from a variety of socioeconomic, cultural and family backgrounds. These include children with a range of family structures, (including sole parents and children under the guardianship of the Minister), families from culturally and linguistically diverse backgrounds and children that have additional needs.

:A highly commited and dedicated Governing Council exists within the Kindergarten. Parents and families are involved within the Kindergarten at a variety of levels.
