### 5. Centre Facilities

#### Buildings and grounds

Our centre has been part of the Largs North Community for almost 60 years. In the mid-1950s a community group, the Largs North Progressive Association, were very keen to provide kindergarten education for the children of the district. They approached the Port Council to make available two blocks of land and fundraised to purchase the materials needed to build the kindergarten themselves. In 1973, an extension to the centre was officially opened.

We have a beautiful nature based outdoor yard. Children have access to natural materials and loose parts. Our indoor environment is inviting and homely. It offers children the freedom to explore, experiment and investigate following their own ideas and interests.

#### Capacity (per session)

We have a floor space of 40, however cap sessions at 36 to ensure a valuable learning experience.

Access for children and staff with disabilities

Our indoor and outdoor environments offer an ease of access for everyone.

We support external services attending our sessions to offer our children a holistic environment for learning.
