Strong relationships are vital in developing a deep understanding of children and their needs, capabilities, motivations and aspirations. Deep understanding of children, their families and our community informs curriculum design, allowing children and educators to work together to co design the learning landscape, so that all may flourish.

Children's natural curiosity, motivations, identity, values and capabilities visibly and actively drive our learning programs. In an ever-changing world, the children of the future will potentially engage in work that has not been imagined yet. Current trends indicate that they will need to be entrepreneurial and independent drivers of their lives and their work. We aim to support our children as citizens of the world to develop valuable social and emotional, literacy, numeracy, physical, self-regulation and planning skills as they begin to build a strong foundation for wellbeing, for learning and for life.

We position *educators as researchers* of and with children. *Continuous deep listening, exploration, shared sustained thinking, critical reflection and responsive intentional teaching* maximises engagement, promotes thinking and challenges children to continually nudge the edge of their zone of proximal development.

We recognise that *our local community is rich in diversity* and we seek to be responsive to and inclusive of this to support children in deepening their sense of identity and belonging.
