#### Enrolment/Attendance

Renmark West Preschool has a maximum enrolment capacity of 15 children. The majority of the 15 children enrolled at any one time come from local families living in close vicinity to the preschool. Preschool attendance has averaged between 90% and 95% over the past five years.

#### Co-located/stand-alone

Renmark West Preschool operates as a stand-alone preschool. We are colocated with Renmark West Primary, sharing their school grounds. We have a separate yarded area and our own facilities. We do utilise some school facilities, including the playgrounds, oval, COLA and hall areas.

### Programs operating at the preschool

### Sessional Kindergarten for eligible children

Renmark West Preschool offers 15 hours of preschool per week to eligible children. Children who turn four between 1 May and 30 April of any given year start preschool as one intake in the January of the year they turn four.

Preschhol days are currently:

Monday 8:45am - 3pm

Tuesday 8:45am - 3pm

Wednesday 8:45am – 11:15am

### Associated Programs

Playgroup operates every Friday of the school term and is supported by a preschool Early Childhood Worker. Playgroup runs from 9am – 10:30am and costs families \$3 per session or \$15 a term as a lump sum payment.

Pre-entry is offered where capacity and timing of transition allows. Sessions are planned by the director and usually run for 2 hours over two weeks.

#### Lunch/Full Day Program

As children attend preschool two days a week over the lunch time period they require lunch. Lunch times are supervised by preschool staff and parents are not required to pay an additional fee for this. All food at preschool is supplied families.

#### Bilingual Support

Support for bilingual children is accessed as required.

#### Preschool Support



Preschool staff work closely with support agencies to ensure children's individual needs are met. Children with an identified need are supported through the preschool support program.

# 5. Centre Facilities

Buildings and grounds

The preschool is a single transportable building with an open space play area. A small kitchen, two children's toilets and an adult toilet are at one end of the building. An office space is located at the other end. There is limited storage inside the preschool. A small verandah area allows for all weather play. The preschool yard is fully fenced and is a very natural space with a large sandpit, mud kitchen, path and rocks. Two sheds outside are used for storage of preschool equipment.

# 6. Local Community (intended for country preschools)

General characteristics:

The Renmark community is diverse in aspects of socio-economical and cultural backgrounds. The preschool is located rurally and many families are from family-owned fruit properties.

Parent and community involvement in the preschool

The preschool seeks a high level of involvement from families. Parents are encouraged to be part of the preschool Governing Council while their child is enrolled at preschool. Staff and parents link through a private social media app called ClassDojo and this is used as a tool to keep in touch with families on a daily basis. Parents are welcomed into the preschool for special days and events and as part of the preschool curriculum on a regular basis.

- Schools to which children generally transfer from this preschool
  Most children at Renmark West Preschool transition to Renmark West Primary with a small percentage each year transitioning to St Joseph's School Renmark.
- Other local care and educational facilities

Strong links exist between Renmark West Preschool and Primary School. The Director works closely with the Director from Renmark Children's Centre and the teacher from Renmark North CPC.

Commercial/industrial and shopping facilities

Renmark has a central plaza with Woolworths and Big W. A Foodland supermarket is located in the township. All major banks have branches located in Renmark. The town also has a public library, hotel, club and theatre.

Other local facilities

A local Medical Clinic operates 6 days per week and a hospital offers some services. A 24 hour emergency department is located at the hospital in Berri, a 15 minute drive from Renmark. Sporting clubs are strong in Renmark with football, hockey, tennis, netball and soccer to name a few.

Availability of staff housing

Government housing available. Rentals and for sale houses also available.

Accessibility

Daily bus between Adelaide and Renmark. The local bus company offer an intertown bus daily which operatates from Renmark throughout Riverland



towns. There is a local Taxi service. Sturt Highway between Renmark and Adelaide is in good condition.
