Framework used

Core Values

Our Core business is the development of preschool programs that focus on children's enjoyment of learning and on the development of the attitudes, dispositions, skills and knowledge for lifelong learning, through teaching and learning in a play-based environment which offers both open ended intentional teaching and structured activities.

We value - trust, honesty, caring, tolerance, excellence, fairness, responsibility, diligence, humour and respect.

Specific curriculum approaches:

Play based learning is an intrinsic curriculum component.

Each child's learning and achievements are valued and recorded with high emphasis on parent communication and participation.

Provision of opportunities and experiences for children to explore and develop different learning styles and to learn according to individual needs.

Focus on small group work and differentiation to develop chioldren's skills and knowledge.

Emphasis on the development of language, literacy, co-ordination, problem solving, social and thinking skills.

Knowledge and development of a range of communication skills (e.g. music, information technologies, arts and creative expression.)

Respect and consideration for each other and the child's family background.

Care and respect for the environment.

Provision of a range of learning experiences outside the home and preschool environment such as excursions and visitors to the pre-school centre.

4. Centre Based Staff

- Performance Management Program:

Based on ongoing and open discussions with staff team members. Each staff member is responsible for their achievement of their personal and site goals through reflection, discussion, relevant training and development. The centre's director facilitates the process.

Access to special support staff:

Support for children with specific learning or developmental needs is accessed from the Early Childhood Support Services, by a referral process. There is a waiting list for Speech Pathology services. The preschool 's

"Early Intervention Grant" is used to support centre staff in developing children's basic skills. Preschool Support workers work with individual children to support their learning and development in specific areas of need. Funds are provided for support for children's support though IESP.

5. Centre Facilities

Buildings and Grounds

The Preschool was built in 1971 and due to new housing developments was extended in 1981. The main building is brick and the extension is an attached transportable building. We have 3 sheds for outdoor storage. We have completed an upgrade to the building to include an ambulant toilet and we now have 3 children's toilets and an art sink. Our outdoor area is large and consists of a large sandpit, a deck, raised platform with a slide, a digging patch, climbing area and many gum and native trees.

: There are access ramps and an ambulant toilet.

6. Local Community (intended for country preschools)

 General characteristics: (eg. types of work available, languages usually spoken at home, local developments)

Most of the children attending the preschool live within one kilometre from the centre. The children are from a diverse range of socio and cultural backgrounds. Approximately 50% of children are from EALD backgrounds. Of these the main languages are Arabic and Dari. Approximately 25% of children are from single parent families. We have approximately 25% indigenous families. The immediate neighbourhood has a mix of old and young people and families.

Parent and community involvement in the preschool

There is parental support and interest in children's preschool activities and curriculum events. There are a small core group of parents who are interested and committed to Governing Council meetings and tasks.

Schools to which children generally transfer from this preschool

The closest main feeder school, Salisbury Downs Primary School, is situated just over half a kilometre from the preschool.
