Numerous Early Childhood Workers who have variable fractions of time. These staff members are employed across programs including Preschool Support and Lunchcare.

## Performance Management Program

Performance Management is undertaken with all staff by the Director on a formal and informal basis as part of the site commitment to improving the quality of the service and programs offered.

## Access to special support staff

Children are able to access specialist support services as part of the Preschool Support Program.

Speech and Language screeners are completed for all children during preentry visits or in their first weeks of enrolment as part of the Early Intervention Program. Staff work in partnership with the Port Lincoln Education Office to support children who require additional support who are referred to Regional Support Services.

Support is also available via referral to Country Health Connect (Port Lincoln) for services such as Physiotherapy, Occupational Therapy and Speech Services for children 0-4 years.

# 5. Centre Facilities

#### Buildings and grounds

The building is a stand alone Centre that was completed in late 2010. Extensions were added to the existing preschool area when the Centre was redeveloped into a Children's Centre for Early Childhood Development and Parenting. The building includes a community room with crèche facilites, a consulting room, staff room for all staff and two office spaces for the Community Team.

The Inclusive Preschool Program / Occasional Care area includes a play area, store room, sleep room, and toilet and change area suitable for children 0-5 with a range of abilities.

The larger preschool area has a large play area, preschool support room and teacher preparation area.

The outdoor learning area has a strong focus on the natural environment.

Edible gardens have been established and a mud kitchen and creek bed installed in the outdoor area.

# 6. Local Community (intended for country preschools)

Employment in Port Lincoln and Lower Eyre Peninsula has a focus on farming, aquaculture and mining.

Children transfer to all schools within Port Lincoln - Kirton Point Primary School, Port Lincoln Junior Primary School, Lincoln Gardens Primary School, Port Lincoln Special School, St. Joseph's School and Navigator College.

## 7. Further Comments

Partnership arrangements with other groups

Kirton Point Children Centre offers programs and services for families in partnership with Dept for Human Services, Child and Family Health Service; Department for Child Protection; Port Lincoln Aboriginal Health Service; Department for Communities and Social Inclusion; Child and Adolescent Mental Health Service; City of Port Lincoln; Community Hub; Port Lincoln Partnership; CentaCare Catholic Services; Uniting Country SA and other organisations and agencies identified through discussions with the community and families.

The centre also receives federal funding through the Department for Prime Minister and Cabinet – Indigenous Advancement Strategy (Children and Schooling).
