Enrolment/Attendance:

2023, we currently have 44 enrolments. However due to mid-year enrolments, our enrolments will increase to 66.

Co-located/stand-alone:

Stand-alone Preschool

Programs operating at the preschool:

Sessional Kindergarten for eligible children:

- Children aged four years and above are eligible to attend preschool for a maximum of 15 hours a week.
- Children who identify as being Aboriginal, Torres Strait Islander or are under the Guardianship of the Minister are entitled to attend preschool for a fixed amount of hours each week, from the age of 3.
- Our preschool sessions are as follows:
 - Yellow Group (Monday and Wednesday)



- o 8:30am-3pm
- Blue Group (Tuesday and Thursday)
 - o 8:30am-3pm
- We offer catch-up sessions throughout each term to meet the entitlement of 15 hours of preschool each week.

Associated Programs: Playgroup

- We offer a free Playgroup session on Friday mornings, 9:30am-11am. This is an educator-led program.

IESP: Inclusive Education Support Program

- IESP is a functional needs based funding model for preschool children and school students with additional needs to have the opportunity to access support for meaningful participation within the preschool program.

This resourcing funds additional educators (preschool support worker) to support children to participate in the curriculum and have access to key specialists within the Department for Education e.g. Speech Pathologist, Special Educator and Behaviour Support Coach

Bilingual Support:

- This program offers support for children from culturally and linguistically diverse backgrounds and who speak English as their second language.

3. Curriculum

At Neta Kranz Children's Centre, we use the Early Years Learning Framework, Department for Education Literacy and Numeracy Indicators, Respect, Reflect and Relate, as well as guidance from the National Quality Framework to guide our practice.



We provide a play-based learning environment that all children can access, engage in, develop and build skills for success.

The Belonging, Being and Becoming: The Early Years Learning Framework for Australia is a framework that we follow at Neta Kranz Children's Centre.

Belonging: to know where you belong and whom with, to live a fulfilling life. A sense of belonging is supported by the relationships developed within their family, community, culture and place.

Being: The here and now, to seek and create meaning within their world.

Becoming: the learning and growth that occurs in the early years that is shaped by different events and circumstances.

We recognise the importance of each child's early experiences and the knowledge they have acquired prior to attending Kindergarten. As educators, we plan to provide experiences that support, enhance and extend children's learning. Children construct understandings through discovery and exploration; therefore, we provide a play based curriculum based on children's interests and voice. We utilise the Early Years Learning Framework to guide our programming. Each child is treated with respect and valued as a unique individual. We acknowledge and respect the bond that Australian Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people have with this land.

The child in the context of their family is valued and building connections between home, the centre and the community is promoted.

Continuous improvement, best practice and quality outcomes underpin our practices. Current research and understandings are considered and applied through a process of ongoing critical reflection.



Greek Language Learning at Kindy:

We offer a Greek language learning program at Neta Kranz Children's Centre that is embedded into our practice and daily routine. Children learn the Greek language through various learning experiences, song and games

Parent Information

We value parents as children's first and foremost educators and embrace collaborative partnerships with parents to develop appropriate programs that are relevant to the learning needs of all children. We encourage parent participation within our preschool through our Governing Council and in volunteering opportunities.

Our educators provide a welcoming, warm, nurturing and safe environment for children through offering various play-based experiences within each environment to support children's learning. We provide learning experiences with a literacy, numeracy, wellbeing, socio-emotional and self-regulating lens. We value child led learning and being co-researchers with children. Children's voice, interests, needs and wonderings guide our programming and planning cycle.

Our program, assessment and reporting processes reflect the outcomes found within the Early Years Learning Framework (EYLF) - Belonging, Being and Becoming. These outcomes are:

- 1. Children have a strong sense of identity
- 2. Children are connected with and contribute to their world
- 3. Children have a strong sense of wellbeing
- 4. Children are confident and involved learners
- 5. Children are effective communicators

Staff Profile:

Our staff profile consists of the following:

Performance Management Program:

Performance conversations are held twice a year between educators and the Preschool Director. Goals are identified and feedback is given in verbal and written forms.

Our educator team, meets weekly to discuss and reflect on our learning program, learning environments, children's individual goals and any upcoming special events.

5. Centre Facilities

Buildings and grounds

The Centre is a purpose built brick building, initially built by the kindergarten union of SA and opened in June 1979. There are extensive low glass windows along the front and side section of the building which assists with bringing the feeling of the outdoors to the inside.

Capacity (per session):

We have a capacity of 22 enrolments per session with our total enrolment cap for 2023 being 44. From term 3, 2023, our enrolment cap increased to 66.

6. Local Community (intended for country preschools)

General characteristics:

Our Centre is located at the eastern end of Whyalla. The Centre is in a settled area, with predominately privately owned homes. We have a reasonable percentage of parents employed by steel making or mining, which is the major industry of the town.



We also have a number of teachers and persons employed at the Whyalla Hospital, which is also located on Wood Terrace.

Our Traditional Custodians:

We acknowledge the Barngarla people as traditional custodians of our land and give thanks for its use. The Barngarla people's rich cultural heritage and spiritual beliefs are connected with this land, maintaining a positive relationship with the living members of their community today.

Parent and community involvement in the preschool:

We value and encourage parent and community involvement at Neta Kranz Children's Centre. The Governing Council is comprised of mostly parents who support the quality improvement planning process of all educators and the preschool, as well as support fundraising opportunities. We value connections from within our local community which impacts on our preschool program by having various visitors visit our site. We have received visits from emergency services personnel and a variety of interest based experiences such as Animals Anonymous and Bugs and Slugs. We value community



connections, with a focus on planning excursions and incursions to support and enhance children's learning.
