# **Buildings and grounds:**

- Our building is a large flat open plan building. It is easily accessible for all children and families, allowing movement to flow easily from indoors to out for children and staff. The Kitchen is centrally located allowing it to be an integral part of our program.
- Our large veranda area is fully enclosable (clear and mesh blinds) with heating and cooling allowing for use all year round.
- Our large outdoor area is filled with natural loose part resouces, that encourages children to initiate their own learning through play which staff then implement into our Emergent Curriculum.
