- In working in partnership with families to promote positive behavioural responses.
- In encouraging, through providing opportunities, children's social, emotional, physical and mental development.
- Children should have opportunities to continue their lifelong learning towards becoming responsible community members and develop their ability to coregulate and self-regulate.

## Educator Responsibilities:

- Acknowledge that children come to kindergarten from a variety of backgrounds and with a range of skills and attitudes.
- Communicate the routines, expectations and boundaries that exist at Kindy using clear, consistent and respectful language.
- Provide encouragement and support
- Provide a stimulating, safe learning environment with clear, safe an fair boundaries
- Role model the use of problem-solving strategies as well as respectful communication and supportive responses
- Encourage children to solve their own problems and intervene, divert,
   support and assist when necessary
- Every respectful and supportive effort will be made to diffuse, modify or circumvent a child's reactions and to calm the child.
- When harmful intentional reactions are exhibited, the child will be moved to a 'quiet' space. Staff will then discuss, demonstrate, communicate or negotiate appropriate alternatives with the child.
- On a rare occasion if a child's reaction is harmful or dangerous to themselves, or others caregivers will be contacted.
- When these harmful reactions are ongoing the educators, in consultation with the family, may submit a referral for additional support.

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
