## 5. Centre Facilities

Buildings and grounds: -Centre was rebuilt in 1984 and set in a vast and beautiful garden with natural shade. The centre has a stand-alone building currently building as well.

- Capacity (per session): 30 children per session maximum
- Centre Ownership: Department for Education inclusive of main building, additional building, sheds and land. The loose parts area is in lease with Barossa Council.
  - Access for children and staff with disabilities:

Provisions exist from access to buildings and children's toilets for wheelchair access. Ramps and hand



rails provide access to sand pit and play platform.

## 6. Local Community (intended for country preschools)

General characteristics:

The Barossa Valley has a strong German heritage and many families work in the wine and tourism industries.

• Parent and community involvement in the preschool: Families are encouraged to be involved and we have a very supportive community and families. Shared roster, volunteers, Governing Council and special excursions on regular Fridays and Local Community events provide opportunities for families and community to connect to the town and wider Barossa Community.

Schools to which children generally transfer from this preschool: The children usually transfer to Tanunda Primary School and the Tanunda Lutheran School. A small percentage transfer to other schools in the Barossa Valley.

Other local care and educational facilities:
 Tanunda Primary School, Tanunda Lutheran School & Early Learning
 Centre, OSHC at the primary school, Barossa Crèche, Stepping Stone
 Child Care and Family Day Care provide child care, Faith Lutheran
 Secondary School, Nuriootpa High School.

Commercial/industrial and shopping facilities: Tanunda is a busy tourist and wine region. Services are good, including, supermarkets, banks and post office.

- Other local facilities:
  - Medical centres, recreation centre (gym, pool, courts), sporting clubs, service clubs, dance classes, art gallery and performing arts centre.
- Availability of staff housing: Private rental and sales through local agents.
- Accessibility: 80kms from Adelaide, daily buses to Adelaide, close to other towns in the Barossa Valley, Taxi services.
