Director's message:

Welcome to your first newsletter for 2023. We want the news to be relevant and useful for you and so please let us know how we can improve on what we provide you with. Think of this letter as an update on what is happening and what other services you may want to access. The first part of the letter is about the curriculum and program followed with information about our other programs both in the Children's Centre building and further afield. The idea is that we support you in your important role of parenting.

It has been wonderful getting to meet you all and get to know your children. The acquaintance night was well attended and provided those who attended with an idea on the teaching and learning that happens in our play based curriculum. For those who weren't able to attend but would like to know more, please make a time to speak with a teacher.

We will offer other opportunities for you to attend events and get to know other families. This newsletter will be a primary source of such information.

A few reminders to keep us all healthy. COVID -19 is still in our community and whilst we are 'living and working with COVID', we need to remind you all that if your child has any symptoms of COVID – which are symptoms of a virus, then please stay home.

We are about to hit some hot weather and our policy requires us to bring children inside or under the veranda where the air conditioner can lower the temperature. This means that children will be in close contact with each other in a reduced space and we will encourage them to engage in quieter play. We will ensure that we actively supervise children and offer appropriate experiences for this situation. If the weather reaches the predicted 38/40C, then it might

be in your child's interest for you to pick them up earlier than the usual dismissal time. Please don't feel pressured to do this, our aim is to ensure you know what the situation will be like, so you can make an informed decision.

Throughout the year we hope to work with families who can add to the preschool. We will have Working Bees, but also we are seeking families who have 'talents' artists, musicians, gardeners etc. Each year we work with families to leave a legacy for the next year, one that the children enjoy designing and developing in the year they attend. This year we are looking to develop a mural on the brick wall and seek anyone that has experience in this. In addition, music is an important part of our curriculum and if you are a musician, we would love you to contact us if you are prepared to play for the children. Not concert style, but in a way that invites children to sit, listen and watch, or respond to - which they will inevitably do as they are hugely attracted to live music. Have a chat with a teacher or myself if you are curious about this and we can take it from there.

I work across two buildings and so you won't always see me at drop off or pick up, but there is always a designated lead responsible person on duty each day. This person is identified on the board above the sign in sheet. However, if you ever need to speak with me please send an email or let a teacher know.

Early Learning Centre/Preschool

Belonging: is integral to human existence. In early childhood, and throughout life, trusting relationships and affirming experiences are crucial to a sense of belonging. – The Early Years Learning Framework for Australia v2.

Over the past 3 weeks children have become familiar with the preschool environment and they are building trusted connections with educators. We have been supporting peer connections through name games, social interactions, child-led play experiences and intentional teaching.

The daily schedule has supported children's wellbeing where they have been able to track, monitor and predict their day. Our focus has been on establishing familiarity with routines and supporting children's independence to follow the signals for these routines throughout the day.

Children have engaged in small group experiences where group norms such as keeping themselves and others safe have been introduced. Through mindfulness children have explored getting in tune with their bodies, taking deep breaths and slowing down their bodies in preparation for lunch.

Thank you to all the families who attended acquaintance night and who have placed a leaf on the Kindy belonging tree. If you are yet to fill in a leaf indicating your hopes and wishes for your child we would love your contribution. This was a good opportunity for us as educators to share with families some of the valuable learning that the preschool environment provides.

We have enjoyed getting to know yourselves and your children and we are beginning to create individual learning plans for each child. Children continue to follow their interests and we are getting to know your children as part of our emergent curriculum.

The program we are developing is based on your child, their interests and abilities as well as the five Outcomes of the Early Years Learning Framework. These Outcomes are:

- Children have a strong sense of identity
- Children are connected with and contribute to their world
- Children have a strong sense of wellbeing
- Children are confident and involved learners
- Children are effective communicators.

Please look at the programming board on your left just inside the main door and speak with a teacher for further information.

We continue to ask families to greet their key educator in the morning (Play Spaces) as this supports children's wellbeing and sense of belonging and safety within the preschool environment. This also strengthens parent/educator relationships and provides an opportunity for families and educators to connect regularly.

Reminders:

- Sign your child in and out each day
- Bring a named hat
- Clearly name all of your child's items
- Name lunch boxes on the outside
- Bring a cold hard pack for food
