- Our Curriculum is play based and scaffolds learning in all developmental areas and follows the interests, strengths and needs of both individual and the group
- Educators take the time to listen to and observe the children, and question them to help them clarify their theories about their world
- Educators discuss and reflect on the children's learning, interests and ideas to plan the curriculum
- Conversation with parents, often in response to their feedback from learning and development, and supports the educators in reflecting on and improving their pedagogy
- The "Implementation Guidelines for Indicators of Preschool Numeracy and Literacy" is key document for assessing and reflecting on Children's numeracy and literacy learning
- The principles of the Reggio Emilia Schools are incorporated into our teaching practice. Children are seen as capable and competent learners. Children's voice is highly valued, and listening to children informs the curriculum. The environment is considered the 'third teacher' and consequently the educators carefully and thoughtfully set the environment to provoke opportunities for the children to explore, discover, question, problem solve, collaborate and communicate in a variety of ways.
