Learning Inquiry: Water and Wildlife

The children have been highly engaged in sustained shared thinking, with the confidence to experiment, explore and co-construct the curriculum as active and involved participants in their learning. Educators have been actively following the children's lead and implementing intentional teaching in both planned and emergent learning opportunities. The children have been sharing their discoveries of how seeds grow and caring for minibeasts and insects in the garden with great excitement and enthusiasm.

Children develop understandings of themselves and their world through active, hands-on investigation using processes such as exploration, collaboration and problem solving. Developing dispositions such as curiosity, persistence and creativity enables children to participate in and gain new learning.
